



OABO - OBA (FIBA) Uniform Clarifications (v4 -oct 2017)

| T- shirts/Short sleeve compression shirt | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal up to and including U17 • To be black, white, or predominant colour of jersey that does not cause confusion with primary colour of opponent’s jersey • All players shall be wearing same colour |
| Compression arm sleeves | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; to be black, white or predominant colour of jersey • All players shall be wearing same colour • Loose fitting long sleeve shirts are illegal |
| Compression leg sleeves | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; dominant colour as the shorts, or black, or white • Includes a compression sleeve where knee pad as integral part • All players shall be wearing same colour |
| Compression underwear (end above knee) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; short legs only which end above the knee, dominant colour as the shorts, or black, or white • All players shall be wearing same colour |
| Compression underwear (extend below knee) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Illegal (long legs that extend past the knee) |
| Headwear | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headwear for religious reasons (i.e. Hijab) is allowed • (if not abrasive and/or pose risk to other players) • Headbands are not considered headwear |
| Knee Pads | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal (individual knee pads that are not part of a sleeve) • No colour restriction |
| Knee Braces | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; shall not pose a danger/risk to other players • Any sharp edges to be covered • No colour restriction |
| Sweat bands | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sweat/Head band worn on head is allowed • Sweat band(s) on wrist(s) are allowed • If both are worn, shall be same colour • To be black, white or predominant colour of jersey |
| Jewelry | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Illegal • Studs must be removed, not taped over • Hairclips should be removed |
| Religious items | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A religious medal if worn, must be taped and worn under the uniform |
| Medic alert Bracelet | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Should be kept at table or by coach |
| Kinesiology Tape | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; no restriction on colour |
| Ankle Braces | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; no colour restriction |
| Socks | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal; no restriction on colour |
| Uniform/Equipment Specifications not covered above | <p>Players shall not wear equipment /objects that may cause injury to other players.</p> <p>The following are not permitted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finger, hand, wrist, elbow or forearm guards, casts or braces made of leather, plastic, pliable (soft) plastic, metal or any other hard substance, even if covered with soft padding. • Objects that could cut or cause abrasions (fingernails must be closely cut). • Headgear, hair accessories and jewellery. (see above exceptions) <p>The following are permitted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shoulder, upper arm, thigh or lower leg protective equipment if the material is sufficiently padded. • Protector for an injured nose, even if made of a hard material. • Spectacles, if they do not pose a danger to other players. |
| Equipment Ruled Legal by OBA for their competitions | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Concussion headgear • Portable insulin pump worn on hip • Cochlear Implants |
| Blood on uniform | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Uniform item must be removed |
