	Legal up to and including U17
T- shirts/Short sleeve compression shirt	• To be black, white, or predominant colour of jersey that does not cause confusion with
	primary colour of opponent's jersey
	All players shall be wearing same colour
Compression arm sleeves	<ul> <li>Legal; to be black, white or predominant colour of jersey</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>All players shall be wearing same colour</li> </ul>
	Loose fitting long sleeve shirts are illegal
Compression leg sleeves	<ul> <li>Legal; dominant colour as the shorts, or black, or white</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Includes a compression sleeve where knee pad as integral part</li> </ul>
	All players shall be wearing same colour
Compression underwear (end above knee)	<ul> <li>Legal; short legs only which end above the knee, dominant colour as the shorts, or black,</li> </ul>
	<mark>or white</mark>
	All players shall be wearing same colour
Compression underwear (extend below knee)	<ul> <li>Illegal (long legs that extend past the knee)</li> </ul>
Headwear	<ul> <li>Headwear for religious reasons (i.e. Hijab) is allowed</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>(if not abrasive and/or pose risk to other players</li> </ul>
	Headbands are not considered headwear
Knee Pads	<ul> <li>Legal (individual knee pads that are not part of a sleeve)</li> </ul>
	No colour restriction
Knee Braces	<ul> <li>Legal; shall not pose a danger/risk to other players</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Any sharp edges to be covered</li> </ul>
	No colour restriction
	<ul> <li>Sweat/Head band worn on head is allowed</li> </ul>
Sweat bands	<ul> <li>Sweat band(s) on wrist(s) are allowed</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>If both are worn, shall be same colour</li> </ul>
	• To be black, white or predominant colour of jersey
Jewelry	• Illegal
	<ul> <li>Studs must be removed, not taped over</li> </ul>
	Hairclips should be removed
Religious items	<ul> <li>A religious medal if worn, must be taped and worn under the uniform</li> </ul>
Medic alert Bracelet	Should be kept at table or by coach
Kinesiology Tape	<ul> <li>Legal; no restriction on colour</li> </ul>
Ankle Braces	<ul> <li>Legal; no colour restriction</li> </ul>
Socks	<ul> <li>Legal; no restriction on colour</li> </ul>
Uniform/Equipment Specifications not covered above	Players shall not wear equipment /objects that may cause injury to other players. The following are not permitted:
	• Finger, hand, wrist, elbow or forearm guards, casts or braces made of leather, plastic,
	pliable (soft) plastic, metal or any other hard substance, even if covered with soft padding.
	• Objects that could cut or cause abrasions (fingernails must be closely cut).
	<ul> <li>Headgear, hair accessories and jewellery. (see above exceptions)</li> </ul>
	The following are permitted:
	• Shoulder, upper arm, thigh or lower leg protective equipment if the material is sufficiently
	padded.
	<ul> <li>Protector for an injured nose, even if made of a hard material.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Spectacles, if they do not pose a danger to other players.</li> </ul>
